

To whom it may concern,

I have been asked to write a letter regarding your decision to reject a claim over an incorrect settlement of a bet.

I want to make it clear that you have absolutely no leg to stand on, or justification to reject this claim.

I was told that my claim was rejected because foxsports and some other websites have amended their results. While other websites such as

have maintained their original awarding over 11 corners.

The key point is that whatever foxsports, or flashscore, or any other website claim is totally irrelevant as it is clearly stated in the TAB's own terms and conditions that

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**wagers on Events will be settled on the official or podium positions as per the adjudication of the relevant, recognised governing body. Subsequent disqualification, promotion of competitors, or any other change is irrelevant** for the purposes of determining the result of a bet.

There is only 1 official governing body, that is the a-league. The a-league official website states that 11 corners were awarded. This is where the decision lies, this is the where the outcome is decided. Nowhere does it state on the TAB's terms and conditions that you can pick and choose which websites you obtain your results from. Nowhere does it state that you can completely disregard the official stats from the official governing body. Or that you can do a manual count and override the decision of the official governing body.

I am a long time and very active punter with the TAB and I am sick and outraged with the ways that outcomes and settlements are manipulated to suit the bookmaker's needs. I had a situation a few seasons ago, where I believed that an outcome was settled incorrectly, but I was told that the results on the official a-league website were final.

I have also had a situation where I placed a winning bet shortly after the event's commencement and wasn't paid out and was refunded. I then had a losing bet placed after the event's commencement, but wasn't refunded my bet.

It is abundantly clear that I am in the right here, and I am refusing to let this go. I will take this as far as possible. My next step will be lodging a dispute with the Victorian Commission of Gaming Regulations

Remember, your own terms and conditions clearly state that I have a winning bet.

Please rectify this situation and pay me out as I am entitled to.
